FAVORITE RECIPE FROM

Kitchen Stadium

Chex Cookie Pizza

Ingredients

- 4 Cups Rice Chex Cereal
- 1/3 Cup Granulated Sugar
- 1/3 Cup Packed Brown Sugar
- 1/3 Cup Peanut Butter
- 1/4 Cup Butter or Margarine, Softened
- 1 Teaspoon Vanilla
- 1 Egg, Beaten
- 2 Cups Miniature Marshmallows
- 1/4 Cup Miniature Semisweet Chocolate Chips
- 2 Tablespoons Coarsely Chopped Honey-Roasted Peanuts (optional)
- 2 Rolls, Fruit Roll-Ups Chewy Fruit Snack, Unwrapped & Torn into Pieces

Directions

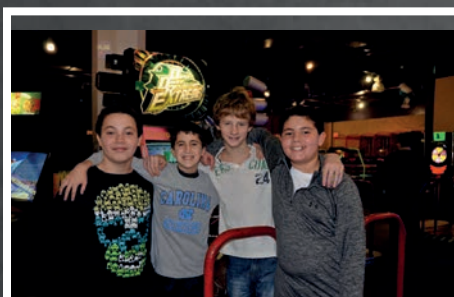
1. Heat oven to 375°F. Place cereal in Ziploc food-storage plastic bag; seal bag and crush with rolling pin or meat mallet.
2. In large bowl, mix sugars, peanut butter, butter, vanilla and egg. Stir in crushed cereal. Spread in ungreased 12-inch pizza pan.
3. Bake 12 minutes. Sprinkle evenly with marshmallows to within 1 inch of edge. Bake 5 minutes longer or until marshmallows are light golden brown. Sprinkle chocolate chips, peanuts and fruit snack pieces over marshmallows to look like pizza toppings. Cool completely on cooling rack. Cut into 16 wedges. Store tightly covered.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

The Value of Quality Instruction at Camp



At Iroquois Springs, we pride ourselves on providing your children with a fun, safe environment for them to develop life skills, such as **independence** and **confidence**, to build strong relationships with both friends and role models, and to engage in a variety of activities that challenge them cognitively and physically.

As a camp we are passionate about giving children the opportunity to engage in diverse activities, which is why we offer everything from soccer and basketball, to ceramics and woodworking, to fencing, rock band, and digital media. No matter the activity area, our focus is on providing children with the highest quality instruction.

Our program philosophy has always focused on **participation and skill development** while having fun. To this end, we feel it is important for children to participate in every activity camp has to offer, which we achieve through the balance of three bunk-assigned periods each morning and an afternoon of two camper-selected electives. Thus the children have an enriching, well-rounded camp experience that allows them to have a great time playing, creating, and exploring in many different activities. To maximize their experiences, we have become more intentional and focused on the quality of the instruction in the activities that we offer so the children have the opportunity to improve existing skills or learn new ones.

What does quality instruction mean in our program areas? It is having the appropriate balance of play and instruction, age and skill appropriate drills/projects, and the ability to keep the program area evolving and fresh with new and creative ideas. While our activity specialists may be great players or practitioners in their chosen specialty, this doesn't always easily transfer into being a great coach or instructor. Thus during our staff training and throughout the camp season, we work closely with our activity specialists to teach and coach them to consider and use these factors when they are planning their drills/projects prior to the campers arrival.

What does quality instruction look like in our program areas? It looks like 13-year-old boys gathering around the **You Build It** specialist, as he introduces the Marble Tube project. A project that involves collaboration, problem solving, and creativity to build a structure using everyday household products that will allow a marble to navigate from the top to the bottom. It is a fun, challenging project that engages the campers cognitively and kinesthetically, but one that looks different when introduced to 13-year-olds and 10-year-olds. While the older boys are allowed more independence, the younger boys would be provided more detailed parameters and extra **hands-on assistance from the instructor**, so that not only are they learning, but succeeding.

It also looks like 9-year-old girls at tennis, after a fun engaging warm-up, practicing their forehand shots using small-handled, light rackets, playing on a smaller court with mini-nets, and using large, soft tennis balls. All of these age-specific tools and strategies are in place to help the children succeed in the goal of improving hand-eye coordination through the forehand shot, and because they are in place the probability of success improves. **Success means confidence and enthusiasm boosts**, which can be seen as the girls cheer for each other and get high-fives from the instructors.

With the direction and guidance of our activity directors and program team, similar results can be witnessed throughout activity areas in camp: campers, guided by activity specialists and supported by cabin specialists, engaged in developmentally-appropriate skill-based learning that allows them to achieve and grow while having the times of their lives with their best friends. There is no doubt that this is the true value of the camp experience at Iroquois Springs.

Summer 2015 is shaping up to be filled with counselors with great character ready to be the difference makers in your children's lives.
