FAVORITE RECIPE FROM Kitchen Stadium

Campfire Eclairs

Ingredients

- 2 Tubes Refrigerated Crescent Roll Dough
- 2 Packages of Pudding Snack Packs (8 Total)
- 1 Jar of Chocolate Frosting
- 1 Can of Whipped Cream
- ¾ Inch Wood Dowels
- Non-Stick Aluminum Foil

Directions

1. Wrap one end of your wood dowel with nonstick foil. Take two pieces of crescent dough and wrap them around the foil.

2. Cook over the fire about 5 minutes or until golden brown. Be sure to rotate as you cook.

3. After the crescent dough is cooked, let it cool on the stick. Gently slide the eclair off the stick.

4. Carefully spoon your pudding inside of the eclair's. Top with chocolate frosting and whipped cream.

POLICY REMINDER

WE WANT TO TAKE TIME TO REMIND YOU OF SOME IMPORTANT POLICIES THAT HELP CREATE OUR CAMP COMMUNITY.

We know one critical component of the camp experience is the opportunity for kids to "unplug." We strongly believe it is central to being at camp and we count on campers and parents to support our stance on this without exception.

In the instance of a camper being found in possession of a cell phone or a disallowed electronic device (any that can access the internet), that camper will have to go home for three nights. Parents will have to make arrangements to pick-up and return the camper to camp. Should the camper be away from camp on the senior trip, parents will need to pick-up their child from the trip location.

WE HOPE THAT THE IDEA OF MISSING THREE ENTIRE DAYS OF CAMP WILL DISCOURAGE CAMPERS AND PARENTS FROM DISREGARDING THIS IMPORTANT POLICY. **REMINDER TO PARENTS...** Apple is no longer making an iPod Nano or Shuffle, however, Iroquois Springs will continue to keep to our policy which does not allow the use of electronics that have a screen or can access the internet. That said, please plan accordingly, as music is a big part of bunk life and we want campers to enjoy listening to their favorite tunes, so please refer to our previous email with suggestions on MP3 devices appropriate for camp.

Many parents and campers have already reviewed and signed the "Policy Agreement" document that outlines our expectation for our camp community each summer. As a new addition this summer to our policy agreement, we want to remind parents that any camper in possession of electronic cigarettes, vaporizers (Juul, Vape Pens, etc.) or other similar devices will immediately be dismissed from camp for the summer without tuition reimbursement, as items such as these have no place in our camp environment.

Thanks for your continued support and cooperation in making Iroquois Springs a camp community we all feel good about calling our summer home. Should you have any questions at all, just call and ask, we are always available to help!
