

FAVORITE RECIPE FROM

Kitchen Stadium

Marshmallow Caramel Oreo Cookie S'Mores Bars

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE CRUST

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted (3/4 of one stick)
- 32 Oreo Cookies or chocolate sandwich cookies, ground

FOR THE TOPPING

- 2 cups mini marshmallows
- 15 caramels, unwrapped and quartered (total of 60 small pieces)
- 3 to 4 tablespoons semi-sweet chocolate chips

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Line an 8-by-8-inch baking pan with aluminum foil leaving overhang, spray with cooking spray; set aside
- 2. For the Crust In a large microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter on high power, about 1 minute; set aside. Add the ground cookies and stir to combine. Transfer crumb mixture to prepared pan and pack it down firmly with a spatula or the bottom of a flat-bottomed drinking glass. Bake for 10-12 minutes, or just until set; don't worry if it's a bit under baked as pan will be going back into the oven in the next step.
- 3. For the Topping Evenly sprinkle the marshmallows over the crust. Evenly sprinkle the caramels, making sure to do it in that order. Bake for about 5 to 8 minutes or until marshmallows and caramel have begun to melt and remove pan before marshmallows start browning or developing color. Immediately upon removing pan from oven, evenly sprinkle the chocolate chips. Allow bars to set up for at least 2 hours before slicing.
- 4. Slice bars by lifting them out using the foil overhang and transfer to a cutting board.
