Difference Makers to camp this summer!



FAVORITE RECIPE FROM

Kitchen Stadium

Heart Shaped Cinnamon Rolls

(JUST IN TIME FOR VALENTINES DAY)

INGREDIENTS

DOUGH

1 cup milk

1.25 oz. package of dry active yeast

1/4 cup warm water

1/6 cup sugar

1/6 cup vegetable oil

1/2 Tbs baking powder

1 tsp salt

1/2 egg

3 1/2 cups flour



FILLING

2 Tbs butter, softened 1/4 cup sugar

4 tsp cinnamon

ICING

4 oz cream cheese, softened 2 1/2 cup powdered sugar

4 Tbs milk

DIRECTIONS

- Heat milk in a small saucepan until it bubbles, stirring frequently so it doesn't burn. Remove from heat and let cool until it's lukewarm.
- Dissolve yeast into 1/4 cup of warm water and let stand for 10 minutes, or until creamy.
- In the bowl of a stand mixer, fitted with the dough hook, combine yeast mixture, warm milk, sugar, oil, baking powder, salt, egg and 2 cups of flour. Mix until the dough is smooth. Slowly add remaining flour and mix until well combined. Knead dough on low speed for 5 minutes, until smooth and elastic. Place dough in lightly oiled bowl, covered, and let sit for 1 hour in a dry, warm place.
- Grease two 9-inch pans with butter and set aside.
- Once the dough has doubled in size (about 1-2 hours), punch dough and place on a lightly floured surface. Roll out into a rectangle, about 13 inches in length. Using an off-set spatula, apply butter and sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. To roll the dough, roll in each long side towards the middle. Cut the log into twelve 1-inch rolls. Pinch the bottom of each roll to make the bottom point of the heart. Place six rolls in each pan, spaced slightly apart. Cover and refrigerate overnight, for at least 12 hours.
- The next day, take rolls out of the refrigerator and let sit at room temperature for 45 minutes to an hour. Preheat oven to 350F while rolls are resting. Also, make icing by mixing the icing ingredients in a bowl with an electric mixer.
- Bake cinnamon rolls uncovered for 25-30 minutes, or until golden brown. Ice while warm.

A WALK THROUGH THE WOODLANDS OF I.S.

With so many wonderful facilities on campus, it is easy to forget that much of the land of Iroquois Springs is undeveloped woodlands, with the largest part located behind Boys Campus. For generations, campers and staff have enjoyed hiking these woods. The Iroquois Springs woodlands hold many secrets and surprises to the adventurous and attentive observer!

The earliest known inhabitants of the land we know as Rock Hill, NY 12775 was the Esopus tribe (es-SOAP-es): a tribe of Lenape (Delaware) First Nations People who were native to modern day Sullivan and Ulster counties. If they have left any sign of their presence on the magical grounds of Iroquois Springs it would be in the traces of old trails in the oldest parts of the woods. This would be off the well-trodden paths. Intriguingly, just off the main path into the woods, a bit beyond Mark and Laura's House, there is a large rock outcropping deposited when a mighty glacier retreated north at the end of the last Ice Age about 12,000 years ago. Stories have been passed down long-ago about campers finding ancient arrow heads beneath the overhang of the rock outcropping. And then there is the tall tale that beneath the outcropping there is an entrance to a network of fabled underground caves. But that is a tale for another time.....

In the 1700's, settlers arrived and cleared much of the original woods and established homesteads. If you are a good observer, you can find the traces they left behind. Scattered throughout the woods behind Boys Side are the remains of stone walls and property boundaries. They have fired the imaginations of generations of campers! These walls - basically long piles of stones - are generally accompanied by clearings in the woods where there are no trees present. Mostly just ferns and ivy. One theory: these are the locations of the homesteads of the first European settlers of Sullivan County. What were their lives like? One thing we are fairly sure of is where many of these early Iroquois Springs citizens got their water supply. On the very edge of camp property is the remains of a small reservoir / well which to this day has a running water supply. If you know where to find it, it's a cool destination for a hiking period. (HINT: Ask Tim, the camp facilities manager, or Mr. Josh Bogard, our Boys Head Counselor!)

For those who are not so adventurous and want to see an artifact over 200 years old, walk down the path to the soccer field. Just before entering the soccer field look to the right, and you will see a row of small boulders: all that remains of an old property boundary. This trace of the distant past survived all the development and clearing of the soccer field during the many years that have passed since those boulders marked a long-gone boundary. Pretty cool to think about!

The woods of Iroquois Springs hold other more recent surprises as well, but that can wait for another time! Just a bit of the fascinating backstory of The Greatest Place in the World!!!!

To start on our eco-centric journey, we recently met with NYSEG (New York State Electric & Gas Corporation) to swap out all of our light bulbs for LED lights. LED lights last longer, save energy, contain no hazardous materials (Mercury free), and allow for less landfill waste.

As you all know from your time at camp, or will soon come to find out, there are many more moving parts in the camp community than just light bulbs. Therefore, we are forming an IROQUOIS SPRINGS "GREEN COMMITTEE" to put our best foot forward and to have a perspective from various people in our camp community, especially our CIT's and veteran staff.

This is an opportunity for our CIT's to formulate ideas, collaborate, and begin their leadership stride for this upcoming summer. This volunteer opportunity will allow them to document hours for school volunteer hours, keep them thinking about camp throughout the year, and it will be a great resume builder for college.
